AGR Report

Director of Instruction, Ryan Ourada reviewed the Achievement Gap Reduction (AGR) report with the Committee.

- Student Reading Achievement Data
 - Early Reading (K/1)
 - focus on early literacy skills
 - o aReading (2-3)
 - computer-adaptive measure of broad reading ability
 - o AUTOReading (2-3)
 - eight subtests that measure the accuracy and rate of phonological (sound), orthographic (spelling), and semantic (meaning) skills.
- Student Math Achievement Data
 - Early Math
 - focus on early math skills
 - o aMath
 - computer-adaptive measure of broad math ability
 - o CBM Math (L1, L2 or L3)
 - evaluates the degree to which basic math facts and operations are accurate and automatic (fluent)
- Trends noticed
 - Overall Reading Achievement (early reading & aReading)
 - K showed a decrease in overall achievement
 - Grades 1-3 generally met or increased from the winter scores
 - Overall Reading Growth is an area of celebration, with 50% of students or more showing aggressive or typical growth
 - Overall Math Achievement and Growth is trending upward
 - Math automaticity and fluency had been a concern in winter, but scores have historically increased for the spring testing period (CBM math)
- How is the data being used
 - o The district specialist team reviewed mid-year data with the principals
 - Principals reviewed their data with staff either during staff meetings or during gradelevel PLC meetings
 - o Reading
 - Provide (Tier II) reading support called Lexia: Core5
 - Continue target-based grading work to focus on proficiency for all students in critical grade level learning targets, complete assessment alignment
 - Integration of Reading Teachers to support K-3 classrooms as a Tier II Support
 - Math
 - Continue use of Dreambox as a strategic (Tier II) math support at the elementary level
 - Continue use of curricular resources from Illustrative Mathematics and Number Corner from Bridges
 - Integration of Number Corner Interventions
